Safe Arrival

Safe Arrival If your child will <u>not</u> be attending school or will be late, it is imperative that you call the school's safe arrival line at **1-833-582-6940** or visit https://sishrsb.ednet.ns.ca/public/ to record them as absent. The automated system will call out for all unaccounted absences. If your child will be arriving late, please record them as absent, and the office will mark them present once they have arrived at school. The automated system is not set up to account for half day absences. Daily attendance and prompt arrival at school ensure your child(ren) and all other students in the class a successful start to their day. Missing even 10 minutes of a morning routine can interrupt student learning. We encourage parents to call the safe arrival line rather than calling the school.

Inclement Weather

Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school buses in the event of severe or inclement weather. Please make sure your child/children are dressed for the weather.

It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. **A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:**

- All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or
- All schools are open, but some or all busses are not operating for the day; or
- Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- All schools are closed for the day.

If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- Bussed students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and
- Walking students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.

There will be no school on December 5 as it is a Professional Learning Day for all grade levels.


The last day of school for 2024 is December 20. The first day of school for students in the new year will be January 3.



HELPFUL HINTS

How can I help prevent my child from getting cavities?

- Water or Sugar free juices are the recommended in between meal drinks
- Fresh Fruit/ Fresh vegetables and cheese are the recommended in between me



- Use a fluoridated toothpaste (small amount, twice a day)
- Children's teeth should be brushed by an adult before bedtime (until the children can tie their shoes or colour in between the lines) and at least one other time during the day.
- Only water should be given to your child overnight after the last brushing of their teeth of the day.
