READING & WRITING AT HOME

You can encourage your child to engage in reading and writing at home in a wide variety of ways. Ask them to help you make the list of errands you have to run, or ask them to retell what happened in a story you just read to them. At first, their writing will be a lot of pictures with some letters here and there. As the year goes on, the letters will turn into words, and the words into a sentence. Ask them to tell you what they have written and which sounds go with the letters they have written. When reading with your children, sounds that they know. Help them to recognize the difference between a word and a letter.

MATH AT HOME

You can help at home by talking about math. Ask your children which shelf they predict boxes will fit on when you are unpacking groceries, what shapes do they see when you are out for a walk, play card and board games, how do they know that you both have the same number of strawberries, etc.?
