- We strive to keep students in class and learning, but if removal is necessary for safety, support will always follow.

Safety Protocol for Families

To help us keep all students safe at Nelson Whynder Elementary, we ask families to follow these important procedures:

- Morning Drop-Off: Students should be dropped off at their assigned door at 8:10 am. If they
 are late, the main entrance. Families are asked not to enter the school building at this time
 unless absolutely necessary.
- Entering the School: For safety reasons, and to limit disruption to classes, parents, guardians and visitors may not go directly to classrooms. All visitors must report to the office.
- Early Pick-Up (Before Dismissal): If you need to pick up your child before dismissal, parents/guardians must sign in at the office. Please remain at the office until a staff member brings your child to you.
- Dismissal time is 2:30pm, students can be picked up at the front of the school.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping us create a safe and welcoming environment for all students.


To sign up, go to BusPlanner at https://hrcetransportation.mybusplanner.ca/ and click on Parent Portal. Follow the instructions to create an account.

Registration/Demographic Updates 2025-2026

On September 9, the Demographic Updates Form will be available to families in the PowerSchool Parent Portal. This form should be updated by every family to ensure all information about your child is current, including contacts, medical information, consents and demographics. Even if there are no anticipated changes, please still review this information and submit the form. This information will then be reviewed by the school before updates are finalized. **The deadline to submit the form is October 6, 2025**. Please ensure you update your Demographic Form. Additionally, this form will include the integration of the "Publication of Student Personal Information and Student Work" form that is required to be updated yearly.

Safe Arrival

Safe Arrival If your child will not be attending school or will be late, it is imperative that you call the school's safe arrival line at 1-833-582-6940 or visit https://sishrsb.ednet.ns.ca/public/ to record them as absent. The automated system will call out for all unaccounted absences. If your child will be arriving late, please record them as absent, and the office will mark them present once they have arrived at school. The automated system is not set up to account for half day absences. Daily attendance and prompt arrival at school ensure your child(ren) and all other students in the class a successful start to their day. Missing even 10 minutes of a morning routine can interrupt student learning. We encourage parents to call the safe arrival line rather than calling the school.



What is SchoolsPlus?

SchoolsPlus is a confidential, free service available in every school in Nova Scotia. Our goal is to build positive relationships between families, schools, and communities. We can help families navigate complicated situations when they are involved with many different services. This helps ensure everyone is communicating clearly and working on shared goals.
